# CENTENNIAL CAMPAIGN GOAL \$10,000,000

## **ACADEMIC & SPIRITUAL**

## \$3,250,000

- » Enhance academic interventions and the resource program expansion to include quiet testing rooms, group instruction space, and collaborative study space. \$250,000
- » Transform the Media Center into the new Student Learning Commons to modernize our approach to teaching and learning. \$500,000
- » Update all classrooms with new seating, aesthetic improvements, and modern technology. \$1,200,000
- » Create a fund to invest in our faculty by providing credentialing scholarships, workshops, and incentive compensation for advancement. \$750,000
- » Renovate the chapel to create a beautiful space for adoration, quiet prayer, team mass, and class prayer. \$350,000
- » Purchase two mini buses to provide transportation for field trips, visiting businesses, and travel to extracurricular events. \$200,000

- » Update common spaces and hallways. \$275,000
- » Replace the roof on the main building. \$750,000
- » Replace campus-wide chillers. \$1,700,000


